

Ebooks : downloading EBSCO ebooks using Adobe Editions

This week we are going to talk about using ebooks offline so that you don't have to be connected to the internet to use the ebooks that UNB Libraries subscribes to and offers to you. We will speak specifically about downloading ebooks from either the EBSCO or the Ebrary platforms, downloading and installing Adobe Digital Editions, which is a software that enables you read ebooks the same way that Adobe Acrobat enables you to read pdf documents. We are also going to look at how you can view ebooks in Adobe Digital Editions.

As always, we will start at the library website www.lib.unb.ca. In UNB WorlCat, which is the library catalogue, we can perform a standard search. In this case, we are going to look at curriculum theory. From our results, we are going to limit our results to ebooks as our chosen format. This first record, "Integrating study abroad into the curriculum: theory and practice across the disciplines," has a couple of platform options. You can view the ebook on either EBSCO or Ebrary.

Let's take a look at the EBSCO platform. Clicking the link takes us to the ebook. We have the option of viewing the ebook directly from EBSCO or downloading it. It's telling me that I'm going to have to sign into by EBSCOhost account or else create one. You will come into the same challenge when you are on the Ebrary platform and wish to download an ebook. In order to create an account in EBSCOhost, you enter the appropriate information, including your first and last name, your UNB or STU e-mail address, a user name and password as well as a security question.

I'm going to sign in to EBSCOhost because I already have an account. Now, it's telling us that we can download and checkout the book; depending on the book, you have up to 7 days. It's also telling us, under "Viewing Requirements" that, for desktop viewing, Adobe Digital Editions 1.7.1. or higher is required. It's also telling us that if you have an Apple or Android device you can use Bluefire Reader. Adobe Digital Editions has both Windows and Mac compatible versions to download. The link will take us to the Adobe Digital Editions site. You can select "Download Now" and choose an installer appropriate for your operating system, save the file, and run it from wherever it was saved.

Once that is accomplished, you can check and download your ebook. It gives you the option to save or open the file. My advice is to save it first, before opening it in Adobe Digital Editions. You can access wherever the book has downloaded onto your computer and the ebook should open seamlessly in Adobe Digital Editions.

Inside the ebook, there is a table of contents that you can use to get to different parts of the ebook. You can navigate the ebook by pressing page down or scroll.

After the 7-day loan period, the book will still appear in your library, but it will not be accessible. Once these books are expired you have to go back to wherever you found them, whether it be to WorldCat or directly to the publisher, and sign them out again.
